

GEN. EISENHOWER'S TRIUMPH

NARROW REPUBLICAN MAJORITY IN CONGRESS

General Eisenhower has won the American Presidential election with the largest popular vote ever received by a Presidential candidate.

The latest figures give the General's popular vote as 31,024,749, giving him 431 electoral college votes, against Mr. Stevenson's 24,948,441 with 100 electoral votes.

The Republicans appear to have a majority of only about 12 in the House of Representatives; in the Senate they will have at least a majority of one.

President Truman has pledged his support to the new Administration and invited the General to the White House to facilitate the transition.

General Eisenhower is expected to fly to Korea after taking a 10-day vacation.

EARTHQUAKE IN FAR EAST

FOUR GREAT WAVES STRIKE HAWAII

NEW YORK, Nov. 5

In little more than an hour yesterday Oahu, one of the northern islands of the Hawaiian group, was struck by four great waves, the last of them 13ft. high, which had swept across the Pacific at 400 miles an hour from a point in the Sea of Okhotsk—generated by a great earthquake centred at Paramushir, just south of the Kamchatka peninsula.

The waves also struck Adak, in the Aleutians, and Midway, in the central Pacific, and the highest of these was nine feet.

In Honolulu harbour, on the southern shore of Oahu, a cement barge, torn from its moorings, struck a freighter a glancing blow and tore away some of its standing rigging, but no other damage was reported there. At Hilo, on the island of Hawaii, a recently completed Government boat house was demolished and coast guard buoys weighing 10 tons were torn from their moorings. On Midway Island the hangar area and the radio transmission room were flooded but there were no casualties.

MAJORITY RAISED BY 347

"VOTE OF CONFIDENCE IN GOVERNMENT"

The result of the by-election in the Wycombe division of Buckinghamshire was declared yesterday as follows:—

Mr. J. E. Haire (Lab.)	24,650
Conservative majority	2,100
No change.			

The by-election was caused by the succession of Mr. W. W. Astor, the Conservative member, to the peerage on the death of his father, Lord Astor. The figures at the General Election were:—Mr. W. W. Astor (C.) 27,084; Mr. J. E. Haire (Lab.) 25,331. Conservative majority, 1,753.

Our Parliamentary Correspondent writes:—

The Government victory in the by-election brought jubilation to the Conservatives and to the Labour Party despondency tinged with relief that things were no worse for them. Mr. Churchill sent a telegram to Mr. Hall, stating: "The electors of Wycombe have again shown the soundness of their judgment in giving the Government this fine vote of confidence."
